Sweet Dreams

With its brilliant hues of orange and yellow, the sun rises on the eastern horizon like a strong man about to run his course (Ps. 19:5). A new day is set before us like a fine meal on a banqueting table. We are invited to feast upon its opportunities. It is "the day which the Lord has made" – a day to "rejoice and be glad" (Ps. 118:24). "From the rising of the sun to its setting the name of the Lord is to be praised" (Ps. 113:3).

It may take a few minutes to shake the cobwebs from our minds.
