HOW DID JESUS WORSHIP?

Jesus worshiped under the Law of Moses, but what is brought out in our text, can be applied to our worship to God under the law of Christ in the Christian age. As we study from Luke 4:14-22; 28-30 let us answer the question: How Did Jesus Worship?

- I. JESUS WORSHIPED REGULARLY (V. 16): It was His custom to go into the synagogue on the Sabbath day. Mary and Joseph are a good example of parents, who trained their children spiritually. Of course, it was Jesus' desire to worship His Heavenly Father. What about our desire to worship God? "Not forsaking the assembling of ourselves together, as the manner of some is; but exhorting one another: and so much the more, as ye see the day approaching" (Heb 10:25). Since "God is a Spirit: and they that worship him must worship him in spirit and in truth," we must have the right attitude as well as worshiping God according to the New Testament pattern (John 4:24).
- II. JESUS WORSHIPED REVERENTLY (V. 16): He stood up to read, as the Jews would stand, when the word of God was read (Neh. 8:5) Is our reverence while praying, the same as when God's word is being preached? Christians speak to God through prayer and God speaks to us through His word. Are we knowledgeable concerning what our worship service behavior should be?
- III. JESUS WAS READY TO WORSHIP (V. 17): He was able to find the right passage, because He was prepared to worship. We should prepare for worship by going to bed

on time in order to get a good night's sleep. Also, we should study our Bible lesson before coming to Bible class. Paul and his companions were prepared to worship God as they traveled: "And we sailed away from Philippi after the days of unleavened bread, and came unto them to Troas in five days; where we abode seven days. And upon the first day of the week, when the disciples came together to break bread, Paul preached unto them, ready to depart on the morrow; and continued his speech until midnight" (Acts 20:6,7).

IV. JESUS REVEALED THE TRUTH – HE IS THE REDEEMER (VS. 18,19): He was reading from Isa. 61:1,2 from the Septuagint LXX translation. Jesus being the Master Teacher revealed truth: "Then said Jesus to those Jews which believed on him, If ye continue in my word, then are ye my disciples indeed; And ye shall know the truth, and the truth shall make you free" (John 8:31-32). Unless we continue in God's word we cannot know the truth (2 Tim. 2:15).

How did the people in the synagogue react to the truth which Jesus had spoken unto them? They were filled with wrath and thrust Jesus out of the city desiring to cast Him off the brow of the hill, but were unsuccessful (Vs. 28-30). HOW DO WE REACT TO THE TRUTH? Do we gladly receive the truth? "Then they that gladly received his word were baptized: and the same day there were added unto them about three thousand souls" (Acts 2:41). Or do we get angry? "When they heard these things, they were cut to the heart, and they gnashed on him with their teeth (Acts 7:54).
